# NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

#### INTRODUCTION

At the AGM, ordinary resolutions will be proposed, amongst other things, to grant to the Directors general mandates to issue and buy-back Shares and to re-elect the retiring Directors. The AGM Notice is set out on pages 14 to 17 of this circular. The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding the above proposals.

#### GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND BUY-BACK SHARES

Ordinary resolutions will be proposed at the AGM relating to the following general mandates:

- (i) authorising the Directors to allot, issue and otherwise deal with additional Shares (and securities convertible into Shares and rights to subscribe for Shares) not exceeding 20% of the aggregate number of Shares in issue as at the date of passing of the resolution;
- (ii) authorising the Directors to buy-back Shares not exceeding 10% of the aggregate number of Shares in issue as at the date of passing of the resolution; and
- (iii) authorising the addition to the mandate to issue new Shares (referred to in (i) above) of those Shares bought-back by the Company pursuant to the buy-back mandate (referred to in (ii) above).

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 402,668,313 Shares. On the assumption that there is no variation to the issued share capital of the Company during the period from the Latest Practicable Date to the date of passing of the resolution approving the mandate to issue new Shares (referred to in (i) above), the maximum number of Shares which may be issued pursuant to the mandate would be 80,533,662, not taking into account any additional new Shares which may be issued pursuant to the mandate referred to in (iii) above.

In accordance with the Listing Rules, and in particular the rules regulating the buy-back of securities on the Stock Exchange, the Company is required to send to Shareholders an explanatory statement containing information reasonably necessary to enable Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the resolution to approve the buy-back by the Company of its Shares. This explanatory statement is set out in Appendix 1 to this circular.

#### **RETIREMENT AND RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS**

In accordance with Bye-law 86(2) of the Bye-laws, Ms Chiang Yun shall retire at the AGM and, being eligible, will offer herself for re-election. In accordance with Bye-law 87 of the Bye-laws, Mr Lee Chi Hong, Robert shall retire by rotation at the AGM and, being eligible, will offer himself for re-election. In addition, each of the non-executive Directors is appointed for a term of two years. As Professor Wong Yue Chim, Richard and Dr Allan Zeman were re-elected as Directors at the annual general meeting in 2014, they will retire at the AGM and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election. Details of the Directors who are seeking re-election at the AGM are set out in Appendix 2 to this circular.

The Nomination Committee of the Company has reviewed and assessed the independence of all the independent non-executive Directors (in particular including Prof Wong Yue Chim, Richard and Dr Allan Zeman who have served on the Board for more than nine years and shall retire from office at the AGM and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election). The Nomination Committee has formed the view that all the independent non-executive Directors have met the independence guidelines set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and have provided their respective annual confirmations of independence to the Company. The Board is therefore satisfied that Ms Chiang Yun and in particular Prof Wong Yue Chim, Richard and Dr Allan Zeman who have served on the Board for more than nine years remain independent and further considers that they should be re-elected in view of their skills, experience and knowledge of the Group's businesses and their abilities to exercise independent judgment in relation to the Company's affairs, which continue to be of significant benefit to the Company.

#### AGM

The AGM Notice is set out on pages 14 to 17 of this circular. A form of proxy for use at the AGM is enclosed. The form of proxy can also be downloaded from the website of Hong Kong Exchanges and Clearing Limited at www.hkexnews.hk and the website of PCPD at www.pcpd.com. Whether or not Shareholders are able to attend the AGM, Shareholders are requested to complete the enclosed form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and deposit it with the Company's branch share registrar, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited, at 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong, as soon as possible and in any event the form of proxy must arrive not less than forty-eight (48) hours before the time appointed for holding the AGM (and any adjournment thereof). Completion and return of a form of proxy will not preclude Shareholders from attending and voting in person at the AGM (and any adjournment thereof) should Shareholders so desire.

#### PROCEDURE FOR VOTING BY POLL

As required under Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll. The chairman of the AGM shall put each of the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM by way of a poll according to Bye-law 66(1) of the Bye-laws.

After the conclusion of the AGM, the results of the poll will be published on the website of Hong Kong Exchanges and Clearing Limited at www.hkexnews.hk and the website of PCPD at www.pcpd.com.

#### RECOMMENDATION

The Directors consider that the grant of the general mandates to issue and buy-back Shares and the re-election of the Directors who are proposed for re-election at the AGM are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Accordingly, the Directors recommend that all Shareholders vote in favour of all of the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

### APPENDIX 1 EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON BUY-BACK PROPOSAL

The following is the explanatory statement required to be sent to Shareholders under the Listing Rules in connection with the proposed general mandate for the buy-back of securities to be granted to the Directors:

#### 1. LISTING RULES REQUIREMENT FOR BUY-BACK OF SECURITIES

The Listing Rules permit companies whose primary listings are on the Stock Exchange to buy-back their securities (which shall include, where the context permits, shares of all classes and securities which carry a right to subscribe or purchase shares, of a company, and shall include warrants) on the Stock Exchange subject to certain restrictions, the most important of which are summarised below:

#### (a) Shareholders' approval

All on-market securities buy-backs on the Stock Exchange by the Company must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution of Shareholders, either by way of general mandate or by specific approval in relation to specific transactions.

#### (b) Source of funds

Buy-backs must be funded out of funds which are legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Memorandum of Association of the Company and the Bye-laws and the Companies Act.

#### 2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 402,668,313 Shares (excluding the 0.2 non-tradable fractional consolidated shares).

Subject to the passing of Resolution No. 5 as set out in the AGM Notice ("**Buy-back Mandate**"), the Company would be allowed to buy-back a maximum of 40,266,831 Shares on the assumption that there will be no variation in the issued share capital of the Company during the period from the Latest Practicable Date to the date of passing of the resolution approving the Buy-back Mandate.

#### **3. REASONS FOR BUY-BACK**

The Directors believe that it is in the best interest of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole for the Directors to have a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Company to buy-back Shares in the market. Such buy-backs may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value and/or its earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such buy-backs will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

# APPENDIX 1 EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON BUY-BACK PROPOSAL

#### 4. FUNDING OF AND IMPACT ON BUY-BACK

Buy-backs pursuant to the Buy-back Mandate would be financed entirely by the available cash flow or working capital facilities of the Company. Any buy-backs will only be funded out of funds of the Company legally available for the purpose in accordance with its Memorandum of Association and Bye-laws and the Companies Act.

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in its latest published audited accounts) in the event that the Buy-back Mandate was to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed buy-back period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Buy-back Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements or the gearing levels of the Company unless the Directors determine that such buy-backs are, taking into account all relevant factors, in the best interest of the Company.

# APPENDIX 1 EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON BUY-BACK PROPOSAL

#### 6. DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that they will exercise the Buy-back Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, the applicable laws of Bermuda and the Bye-laws.

Where a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases as a result of Share buy-back by the Company, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purpose of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Asian Motion Limited, a wholly-owned subsidiary of PCCW, held approximately 70.80% of the total number of issued Shares. As the Buy-back Mandate allows the Company to buy-back a maximum of 40,266,831 Shares, in the event that the Directors should exercise the Buy-back Mandate in full, the shareholding of Asian Motion Limited in the Company would increase to approximately 78.67% of the total number of issued Shares. The Directors are not aware of any obligation to make a mandatory offer pursuant to Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code which could arise as a result of any buy-backs of Shares pursuant to the Buy-back Mandate. In any event, the Directors have no present intention to exercise the Buy-back Mandate in full.

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their respective close associates, presently intend to sell any Shares to the Company or its subsidiaries under the Buy-back Mandate in the event that the Buy-back Mandate is approved by Shareholders.

No core connected persons of the Company have notified the Company that they have any present intention to sell any Shares, or that they have undertaken not to sell any Shares held by them to the Company, in the event that the Buy-back Mandate is approved by Shareholders.

#### 7. SHARE BUY-BACKS MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company has not bought-back any of its Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) in the six months preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

Set out below are particulars of the Directors who are seeking re-election at the AGM. Their Directors' fees, if any, will be determined by the Board under the authority granted by Shareholders at the annual general meetings. Save as disclosed below, PCPD is not aware of any other matters relating to their re-election that should be disclosed pursuant to the requirements under Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules or that should be brought to the attention of Shareholders.

(1) LEE Chi Hong, Robert, aged 64, is an Executive Director, the Deputy Chairman, the Chief Executive Officer of PCPD and a member of PCPD's Executive Committee. He became a director of PCPD in May 2004. He is also an Executive Director of PCCW and a member of PCCW's Executive Committee and is a Director of certain PCCW subsidiaries.

Mr Lee was previously an Executive Director of Sino Land Company Limited ("Sino Land"), at which his responsibilities included sales, finance, acquisitions, investor relations, marketing and property management. Prior to joining Sino Land, Mr Lee was a senior partner at Deacons in Hong Kong, where he specialized in banking, property development, corporate finance and dispute resolution in Hong Kong and mainland China. Before that, he was a solicitor with the London firm Pritchard Englefield & Tobin (now Thomas Eggar incorporating Pritchard Englefield). He was enrolled as a solicitor in the United Kingdom in 1979 and admitted as a solicitor in Hong Kong in 1980. He became a Notary Public in Hong Kong in 1991.

Mr Lee had also served as a member of the panel of arbitrators of the China International Economic and Trade Arbitration Commission of the China Council for the Promotion of International Trade in Beijing.

Mr Lee is a member of the International Council of the Louvre as well as an Ambassador for the Louvre in China.

Mr Lee graduated from Cornell University in the United States in 1975 with a bachelor's degree in Political Science.

Other than the positions disclosed above, Mr. Lee has not held other directorships in any listed public companies in the last three years and does not have any relationship with any other Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of PCPD. As at the Latest Practicable Date, he did not have any interest in Shares which was required to be disclosed under Part XV of the SFO.

Mr Lee has entered into a service contract with a wholly-owned subsidiary of PCPD which may be terminated, by either party, on a six months' notice. Pursuant to his service contract, Mr Lee is currently entitled to an annual remuneration of approximately HK\$14.5 million and other benefits in kind and to participate in PCPD's provident fund scheme. He is also eligible to receive performance-related bonus. His remuneration has been determined with reference to his job complexity, workload and responsibilities with PCPD and PCPD's remuneration policy. In addition, he has entered into a letter of appointment as Executive Director of PCPD pursuant to which he is not entitled to receive any director's fees, remuneration, benefits or other entitlements.

(2) **Prof WONG Yue Chim, Richard**, SBS, JP, aged 63, is an Independent Non-Executive Director of PCPD, the Chairman of PCPD's Audit Committee and a member of PCPD's Remuneration Committee and Nomination Committee of the Board. He became a director of PCPD in July 2004.

Prof Wong is a Professor of Economics at The University of Hong Kong. He was awarded the Silver Bauhinia Star in 1999 by the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region for his contributions in education, housing, industry and technology development. In addition, Prof Wong was appointed a Justice of the Peace in July 2000. He studied Economics at the University of Chicago and graduated with a Doctorate in Philosophy.

Prof Wong is currently an Independent Non-Executive Director of the following listed companies in Hong Kong:

- (1) Great Eagle Holdings Limited;
- (2) Orient Overseas (International) Limited; and
- (3) Sun Hung Kai Properties Limited.

Prof Wong is also an Independent Non-Executive Director of the following companies:

- (1) Link Asset Management Limited (the manager of Link Real Estate Investment Trust, a Hong Kong listed company); and
- (2) Industrial and Commercial Bank of China (Asia) Limited (withdrawal of listing of shares on the Stock Exchange since 21 December 2010).

Prof Wong was an Independent Non-Executive Director of CK Life Sciences Int'l., (Holdings) Inc. from June 2002 to May 2015.

Other than the positions disclosed above, Prof Wong has not held other directorships in any listed public companies in the last three years and does not have any relationship with any other Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of PCPD. As at the Latest Practicable Date, he did not have any interest in Shares which was required to be disclosed under Part XV of the SFO.

Prof Wong does not have a service contract with the Group. He was appointed for a term of two years commencing on May 7, 2014. Prof Wong is entitled to a director's fee of HK\$228,200 per annum. Such fee was determined by reference to his duties and responsibilities with PCPD.

(3) **Dr Allan ZEMAN**, GBM, GBS, JP, aged 67, is an Independent Non-Executive Director of PCPD, the Chairman of PCPD's Nomination Committee of the Board and a member of PCPD's Audit Committee of the Board. He became a director of PCPD in June 2004.

Dr Zeman is the Chairman of Lan Kwai Fong Group, a major property owner and developer in Hong Kong's Lan Kwai Fong, one of Hong Kong's popular tourist attractions and entertainment districts. Dr Zeman is also an Independent Non-Executive Director of Sino Land, Tsim Sha Tsui Properties Limited, Global Brands Group Holding Limited, Television Broadcasts Limited and a board member of The "Star" Ferry Company, Limited. Besides all the board appointments in Hong Kong, Dr Zeman is an Independent Non-Executive Director and the Vice Chairman of Wynn Macau, Limited, a prominent gaming company in Macau.

Having lived in Hong Kong for over 45 years, Dr Zeman has been very involved in Government services as well as community activities. Dr Zeman serves as a member of the Board of West Kowloon Cultural District Authority, and is the Chairman of its Performing Arts Committee. He is also the appointed member of the Economic Development Commission of Hong Kong, a member of the General Committee of the Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce, a member of the Board of Governors of The Canadian Chamber of Commerce in Hong Kong and a member of the Asian Advisory Board of the Richard Ivey School of Business, The University of Western Ontario. In January 2015, Dr Zeman was appointed by the Chief Executive of the HKSAR Government to be a Representative of Hong Kong China to the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation Business Advisory Council. In June 2015, Dr Zeman was appointed as a board member of the Airport Authority of Hong Kong. Dr Zeman is also a board member of The Hong Kong Entrepreneurs Fund of Alibaba Group which was launched in November 2015. Dr Zeman was the Chairman of Hong Kong Ocean Park from July 2003 to June 2014 and he is now the honorary advisor to the Park.

Dr Zeman is a holder of Honorary Doctorate of Laws Degree from The University of Western Ontario, Canada. He is also a holder of Honorary Doctorate of Business Administration from City University of Hong Kong as well as The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology.

Other than the positions disclosed above, Dr Zeman has not held other directorships in any listed public companies in the last three years and does not have any relationship with any other Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of PCPD. As at the Latest Practicable Date, he did not have any interest in Shares which was required to be disclosed under Part XV of the SFO.

Dr Zeman does not have a service contract with the Group. He was appointed for a term of two years commencing on May 7, 2014. Dr Zeman is entitled to receive a director's fee of HK\$228,200 per annum. Such fee was determined by reference to his duties and responsibilities with PCPD.

(4) CHIANG Yun, aged 48, is an Independent Non-Executive Director of PCPD, the Chairman of PCPD's Remuneration Committee of the Board and a member of PCPD's Audit Committee and Nomination Committee of the Board. She became a director of PCPD in May 2015.

Ms Chiang has over 22 years of private equity investment experience and is now a founding managing partner of Pacific Alliance Equity Partners, the private equity division of Pacific Alliance Group ("**PAG**"). Prior to joining PAG, she was a vice president in AIG Investment Corporation. She is currently an Independent Non-Executive Director of the following listed companies in Hong Kong:

- (1) Sands China Ltd.;
- (2) Goodbaby International Holdings Limited;

and an Independent Non-Executive Director of the following listed company in London:
